AN ACT to amend the Customs Act No. 9 of 2015.

[29th December, 2017].

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen’s Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and the House of Representatives and by the authority of the same as follows—

1. This Act may be cited as the

Short title.

CUSTOMS (AMENDMENT) (NO.3) ACT, 2017

and shall be read as one with the Customs Act, No. 9 of 2015, hereinafter referred to as the “principal Act”.

2. Section 248 of the principal Act is repealed and the following substituted therefor—

Repeal and substitution of section 248 of principal Act.

“Regulation of customs brokers and tariff clerks.

248. (1) The Minister may make regulations generally respecting the establishment, licensing and regulation of customs brokers and tariff clerks.

(2) Without limiting the generality of subsection (1), the Minister may by regulations provide for—

- (a) the establishment of the Customs Brokers and Tariff Clerks Board, its composition, tenure of members, functions, powers of the Board, expenses and revenues, procedures and other matters relating to the functions of the Board;
- (b) the licensing, registration and examination of customs brokers and tariff clerks;
- (c) the renewal and revocation of licences granted to customs brokers and tariff clerks;
- (d) recognition of licences granted in other CARICOM Member States to persons to practise as customs brokers and tariff clerks;
- (e) payment of fees in relation to the application for licences and the grant and renewal of licences;
- (f) Code of Ethics for customs brokers and tariff clerks;
- (g) penalties in accordance with section 264 of the Act for breach of the Customs Brokers and Tariff Clerks Code of Ethics, these Regulations and other professional misconduct of customs brokers and tariff clerks;

(h) prescribing anything that is required to be done under the Act.

(3) Regulations made under this section shall be subject to negative resolution of Parliament.”
