AN ACT to amend the Constitution of Grenada so that after other amendments are carried out Chapters and Sections would be repositioned and renumbered and references to existing sections would be altered correspondingly if necessary in both the body of the Constitution and in the Schedules.

[By Proclamation].

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and the House of Representatives of Grenada, and by the authority of the same as follows—

1.—(1) This Act may be cited as the

**CONSTITUTION OF GRENADA (RESTRUCTURING)
(AMENDMENT) ACT, 2016.**

(2) This Act shall come into effect on such date as may be appointed by Proclamation issued by the Governor-General and published in the *Gazette*; and different dates may be appointed for the various provisions of this Act.

(3) This Act shall be read and construed as altering the Constitution.

Interpretation.

2. In this Act—

“Constitution” means the Constitution of Grenada which is set out in Schedule 1 to the Grenada Constitution Order, 1973.

Insertion of section in the Constitution.

3. The Constitution is altered by inserting after section 39 the following—

“Formal alterations to this Constitution

39A. —(1) Upon enactment and commencement of a Bill to alter this Constitution in accordance with section 39, and subject to the provisions of this section, the Attorney-General may make the following formal alterations to the provisions of this Constitution—

- (a) repositioning, rearranging or renumbering the provisions of this Constitution in any group or sequence as may be more convenient;
- (b) altering the references to provisions of this Constitution that have been renumbered under paragraph (a), in other provisions of this Constitution and in the Schedules to this Constitution;

- (c) amending grammatical and typographical errors; and
- (d) amending terms and expressions to achieve the objects of the Bill to alter this Constitution.

(2) Nothing in subsection (1) shall be taken to confer on the Attorney-General the power to make any alteration that affects the substance of this Constitution or any part of it.

(3) An alteration to this Constitution under this section shall not come into effect unless and until—

- (a) the alteration has been approved by a resolution of both Houses of Parliament supported by the votes of a majority of all the members of each House; and
- (b) the resolution approving the alteration has been published in the *Gazette*. ”.
