**CHAPTER 114**  
**FOREIGN JURISDICTION (EXPENSES OF TRIAL) ACT**

**An Act to provide for the proper incidence of expenses arising out of the trial and the conviction or acquittal on the ground of insanity of citizens of Grenada tried by foreign courts.**

[25th October, 1889.]

**1. Short title**

This Act may be cited as the Foreign Jurisdiction (Expenses of Trial) Act.

**2. Expenses of trial how to be defrayed**

If a citizen of Grenada commits an offence in a foreign country, and by a court in that country, is either convicted or acquitted on the ground of insanity, the expenses (so far as they cannot be met out of the effects of the prisoner under an order of such court) of his or her removal to Grenada or a place in which he or she is to undergo his or her sentence or be confined as a criminal of unsound mind, and of his or her maintenance during his or her imprisonment or confinement, and any other expenses incident to his or her conviction, or his or her acquittal on the ground of insanity, shall be defrayed by the Government.

**3. Payment of expenses**

It shall be lawful for the Minister responsible for finance to issue his or her warrant to the Permanent Secretary (Finance) authorising the payment of such expenses out of the Consolidated Fund when he or she has satisfied himself or herself that the conditions rendering the Government liable have been fulfilled.
