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CHAPTER 132

ACT

An Act to provide for the incorporation of a body to be known as the Incorporated Trustees of the Grenada United Spiritual Baptist Church.

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Grenada United Spiritual Baptist Church (Incorporation) Act.

2. Incorporation of trustees

Norton Strachan, Adina Noel, Edward Clyne, Harbin Williams, Lionel Andrew and their successors in office as trustees of the Grenada United Spiritual Baptist Church (hereinafter called “the Church”) shall be a body corporate known as The Incorporated Trustees of the Grenada United Spiritual Baptist Church (hereinafter called “the Trustees”) with perpetual succession and a Common Seal and with power in that name to sue and be sued in all courts.

3. Vesting of property

All churches, chapels, mission houses, rectories, vicarages, parsonages, glebes, buildings and land which may be acquired or appropriated to the uses of the Church are vested in the Trustees.

4. Power of trustees to acquire property

Subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Church, the Trustees shall have full power to acquire for the Church by gift, grant, purchase, devise or otherwise any land or other property of whatever kind whether in perpetuity or for a term of years and any money, securities, goods or chattels whatever, to take, hold and enjoy the same subject to the performance of any trust upon which the same may have been acquired.

5. Power of trustees to dispose of property, and to borrow, etc.

Subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Church and to the performance of any trust as aforesaid the Trustees may—

- (a) sell, demise, grant, convey, transfer, alienate or otherwise dispose of any property which may hereafter be acquired or become vested in them;
- (b) borrow money and, for the payment of the same, by deed under the Common Seal, give and execute mortgages, charges, pledges and other securities of their real and personal property, with any covenants, powers and provisions they think proper.

6. Affixing of Common Seal

All documents requiring the Common Seal shall be sealed in the presence of at least two of the Trustees who shall sign every such document.

7. Address for service, etc.

(1) The Trustees shall at all times have a fixed address in Grenada for the service of documents on them and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar of Companies.

(2) Any document may be served on the Trustees by leaving the document at, or by sending it by registered post to, the address registered pursuant to subsection (1).
