CHAPTER 17

ANZAC (RESTRICTION ON TRADE USE OF WORD) ACT

An Act to prohibit the use of the word Anzac in connection with any trade, business, calling, or profession.

[Cap. 17 of 1958.]

[16th April, 1917.]

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Anzac (Restriction on Trade Use of Word) Act.

2. Prohibition of the use of the word Anzac in connection with any trade, etc.

(1) As from the commencement of this Act it shall not be lawful to use in connection with any trade, business, calling, or profession the word "Anzac", or any word closely resembling that word, without the authority of the Minister given on the request of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia or the Government of New Zealand, and this prohibition shall apply notwithstanding that such word forms part of any trade mark, or of the name of any company or society or other body, registered before the commencement of this Act.

(2) Any person who contravenes subsection (1) is guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of five hundred dollars, or in the case of a second or subsequent conviction of five thousand dollars, and when a company or society is guilty of any such contravention, without prejudice to the liability of the company or society, every director, manager, secretary, or other officer of the company or society who is knowingly a party to the contravention, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to the like penalty.
