CHAPTER 4 AFRICAN METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH (INCORPORATION) ACT

An Act to provide for the incorporation of, and the vesting of property in, the Incorporated Conference Board of Trustees of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in Grenada.

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the African Methodist Episcopal Church (Incorporation) Act.

2. Incorporation of the Conference Board of Trustees

Reverend Flemming Emmanuel Joseph, Reverend Elder Walter Clarence, Reverend Gwendolyn Onley, Mr. Wilson St. Bernard and Mr. Huntley Williams and their successors in office as members of the Conference Board of Trustees of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in Grenada (hereinafter called "the Church") shall be a body corporate known as The Incorporated Conference Board of Trustees of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in Grenada (hereinafter called "the Board of Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and a Common Seal, and in that name power to sue and be sued.

3. Vesting of property

All churches, chapels, mission houses, rectories, vicarages, parsonages, glebes, buildings, and land vested in any person and appropriated to the uses of the Church are transferred to and vested in the Board of Trustees.

4. Board of Trustees may acquire property

Subject to the rules, regulations and control of the Church in its Book of Discipline the Board of Trustees shall have power to acquire for the Church by gift, grant,

purchase, devise or otherwise land, buildings, messuages and hereditaments of whatsoever nature or kind in perpetuity or for life or lives or for a term of years, and also money, goods and chattels, and subject to such rules, regulations and control and to the performance of any trust upon which the said land, buildings, messuages, hereditaments, money, goods and chattels may have been acquired, to take, hold and enjoy the same.

5. Board of Trustees may dispose of property

Subject to the rules, regulations and control aforesaid and to the performance of any such trust, the Board of Trustees may sell, demise, grant, convey, transfer, alienate or otherwise dispose of any property vested by this Act in them or which may hereafter be acquired by or become vested in them.

6. Mode of sealing of documents

All documents requiring the Common Seal of the Board of Trustees shall be sealed in the presence of two members of the Board of Trustees who shall sign every such document.

7. Service of documents on Board of Trustees

(1) The Board of Trustees shall at all times have a fixed address in Grenada for the service of documents on the Board of Trustees and such address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar of Companies.

(2) Any document may be served on the Board of Trustees by leaving the document at, or by sending it by registered post to, the address registered pursuant to subsection (1).
