

PEOPLE'S LAW NO. 24 OF 1983

PROCLAMATION

BY THE

PEOPLE'S REVOLUTIONARY GOVERNMENT

A LAW to disqualify persons who are appointed to the service of the Government of Grenada on or after the appointed day from pensions, gratuities or other benefits under the Scheduled enactments.

[*Gazetted 16th September, 1983*].

WHEREAS the National Insurance Law 1983 (No. 14 of 1983) which came into operation on the appointed day makes provision for the payment of various benefits including age pensions and age grants to persons employed by the Government :

AND WHEREAS persons who are appointed to the service of the Government of Grenada on or after the appointed day should no longer be entitled to qualify for benefits under the Scheduled enactments :

NOW THEREFORE in the exercise of the powers vested in the People's Revolutionary Government by People's Law No. 2 (Establishment of People's Revolutionary Government) and in exercise of the powers vested in the Prime Minister by People's Law No. 10 (Declaration and Effect of Laws) it is hereby ORDERED and PROCLAIMED as follows :

1. This Law may be cited as the
PENSIONS (DISQUALIFICATION) LAW 1983.

Short title.

2. In this Law—

“appointed day” means the 4th April 1983;

Interpreta-
tion.

“Scheduled enactments” means the enactments set out in the Schedule to this Law.

Disqualifica-
tion.

3. Any person who is appointed to a post in the service of the Government of Grenada on or after the appointed day shall not be entitled to any pension, gratuity or other allowance under any of the Scheduled enactments.
