STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS NO. 37 OF 2019

THE MINISTER IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED ON HIM BY SECTION 39 OF THE IMMIGRATION ACT CAP. 145 HEREBY MAKES THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS—

**1. Citation.** These Regulations may be cited as the—

IMMIGRATION (EXTENSION OF PERMIT FEE) (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2)  
REGULATIONS, 2019.

and shall be read as one with Immigration (Extension of Permit Fee) Regulations, Chapter 145 hereinafter referred to as the “principal Regulations”.

**2. Amendment to regulation 3 of principal Regulations.** Regulation 3 of the principal Regulations is amended by repealing subregulation (3).

**3. Insertion of new regulation 3A to principal Regulations.** The principal Regulations is amended by inserting after regulation 3 the following new regulation—

**“3A. Extension of stay for business.**—(1) Where a person has been granted a permit to remain in Grenada under the condition that he or she remains as a visitor on vacation but wishes to apply for a work permit, the person may make an application for an extension of stay to remain in Grenada as a visitor on business for such period not exceeding twelve months as may be specified in the permit.

(2) An application under subregulation (1) shall be made to the Chief Immigration Officer in the form provided in the First Schedule.

(3) Subject to subregulation (4), the Chief Immigration Officer may upon receipt of the application, grant the application if he or she is satisfied that the person is not an undesirable person within the meaning of section 2 of the Act.

(4) Where the Chief Immigration Officer grants the application for an extension of stay and change of condition under this regulation, the applicant shall be required to pay a fee of six hundred dollars.”.
