

**RESOLUTION FOR THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 4 (3) OF THE  
QUARANTINE ACT, CHAPTER 271**

**WHEREAS** it is provided by section 4 (1) of the Quarantine Act, Chapter 271 (hereinafter referred to as “the Act”) that the Minister may make regulations, as respects the whole or any part of Grenada, including the ports and coastal waters thereof, for preventing—

- (a) danger to public health from ships or aircraft or persons or things therein, arriving at any place; and
- (b) the spread of infection by means of any ship or aircraft about to leave any place, or by means of any person or thing about to leave any place in any ship or aircraft;

**AND WHEREAS** it is provided in section 4 (3) of the Act that regulations made under section 4 (1) of the Act shall not have any force or effect until confirmed by resolution of the House of Representatives;

**AND WHEREAS** on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2020 the Minister with responsibility for Health made the Quarantine (COVID-19) Regulations, 2020 and on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2020 the House of Representative by resolution confirmed the Quarantine (COVID-19) Regulations, 2020;

**AND WHEREAS** it is now expedient that the Quarantine (COVID-19) Regulations, 2021 attached hereto as a Schedule be confirmed by the House of Representatives to repeal and replace the Quarantine (COVID-19) Regulations, 2020;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that pursuant to the provisions of section 4 (3) of the Act that the Quarantine (COVID-19) (Amendment) Regulations, 2021 be now confirmed by the House of Representatives.

**THE MINISTER IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED ON HIM BY SECTION 4 OF THE QUARANTINE ACT, CHAPTER 271 HEREBY MAKES THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS—**

**Citation**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the

**QUARANTINE (COVID-19) REGULATIONS, 2021.**

**Definitions**

2. In these Regulations—

“**COVID-19**” means the Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCov), which is an infectious disease caused by a virus which, having emerged during 2019, was declared a global pandemic by the World Health Organisation on the 11th March, 2020;

“**government-approved place of observation and isolation**” includes tourist accommodation premises approved by the Ministry of Health;

“**Health Officer**” means the appropriate officer appointed as such under section 3 of the Act;

“**isolation**” means the removal to a hospital or other suitable place approved by a Health Officer of a person suffering, or suspected to be suffering, from COVID-19, and his or her detention therein, until, in the opinion of a Health Officer he or she is no longer infectious;

“**NAAT**” means a Nucleic Acid Amplification Test diagnostic test for SARS-CoV-2 or COVID-19;

**“observation”** means the detention under medical supervision of persons in such places and for such periods as may be directed by a Health Officer;

**“PCR test”** means a COVID-19 RT-PCR test from a laboratory–

- (4) operated by the Government of Grenada; or
- (b) operating with accreditation by a relevant accrediting body to the internationally recognized standard ISO 15189, including the United Kingdom Accreditation Service (UKAS), the College of American Pathologists (CAP) or an equivalent State or national accreditation body;

**“public health officer”** means a registered health practitioner or registered nurse, employed or contracted by the Government;

**“rapid antigen test”** means an immunoassay that detects the presence of the antigen for SARS-CoV-2 or COVID-19;

**“SARS-CoV-2”** means severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2;

**“State of origin”** means the State, country or territory in which a person has entered within the last 21 calendar days, including having been only in transit, whether or not the person had subsequently entered another State, country or territory;

**“test for COVID-19”** means a PCR test or rapid antigen test.

### **Application**

- 3. (1) Regulations 6 (1) shall not apply to children two years and under.
- (2) Regulations 6 (3) (i) shall not apply to children under the age of seven.

### **Application of Quarantine (Air) Regulations and Quarantine (Maritime) Regulations**

- 4. For the avoidance of doubt, the Quarantine (Air) Regulations and the Quarantine (Maritime) Regulations shall apply to the extent that those regulations do not conflict with these Regulations.

### **Health declaration form**

5. (1) No person shall be admitted into Grenada unless he or she discloses every State of origin and completes and executes a health declaration form as set out under the Schedule, upon his or her arrival.

(2) For the purposes of subregulation (1), if any person makes any false statement or withholds any material information, he or she shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

### **Procedure for entry**

6. (1) A person shall not be admitted into Grenada, unless—

- (a) he or she has subjected himself or herself to a PCR test or NAAT test not more than 72 hours before arriving in Grenada, subject to regulation 7 (5);
- (b) the result of the PCR test or NAAT test is negative; and
- (c) subject to subregulation (2), he or she undertakes to subject himself or herself to—
  - (i) mandatory observation and isolation for a minimum of seven calendar days at a government-approved place of observation and isolation at his or her expense;
  - (ii) a test for COVID-19, at his or her expense, conducted by a public health officer for the purposes of subregulation (3).

(2) Upon a written application, the Chief Medical Officer may approve a person travelling to Grenada for self-isolation at a place of residence for the period of mandatory observation and isolation under subregulation (1) (c), if the Chief Medical Officer is satisfied that the place is suitable for adequate accommodation and separation from other persons.

(3) A person shall not be released from observation and isolation or self-isolation as the case may be, unless—

- (a) he or she first subjects himself or herself to a test for COVID-19; or

(b) 14 calendar days elapse from his or her date of entry,

whichever first occurs.

(4) Where the result of a test under subregulation (3) is negative, the person shall be released from observation and isolation or self-isolation as the case may be, and permitted to integrate with the public.

(5) Where the result of a test under subregulation (3) is positive, the person shall remain under observation and isolation or in self-isolation as the case may be, until a Health Officer determines that the person is infectious.

(6) Upon a determination by a Health Officer under subregulation (5), the person shall be released from observation and isolation or self-isolation, and be permitted to integrate with the public.

(7) Where a person arrives in Grenada without a result for a PCR test or NAAT test under subregulation (1) (b), the person shall be subject to—

(a) mandatory observation and isolation for a minimum of 14 calendar days at a government-approved place of observation and isolation at his or her expense; and

(b) subregulation (3).

### **Waiver of entry requirements**

7. (1) Where the Chief Medical Officer is satisfied that a person is fully vaccinated, the application of subparagraph (i) or (ii) of regulation 6 (1) (c) may be waived in respect of that person, subject to such conditions as the Chief Medical Officers deems appropriate and with consideration to subregulation (3).

(2) For the purposes of subregulation (1), a child under the age of twelve shall be deemed to be fully vaccinated if he or she is travelling accompanied by a person aged eighteen or older who is fully vaccinated.

(3) Subregulation (1) may not apply in the case of a child over the age of eleven but under the age of eighteen who is not fully vaccinated but travelling accompanied by a person aged eighteen or older who is fully vaccinated.

(4) For the purposes of this regulation, a person is fully vaccinated if he or she produces a vaccination card evidencing he or she has received—

- (a) in the case of a COVID-19 vaccine that has been approved by the World Health Organization as requiring two doses, a second dose within the period as approved by the World Health Organization; or
- (b) a COVID-19 vaccine that has been approved by the World Health Organization as requiring one dose,

and at least two weeks have elapsed from the second dose or the one dose, as the case may be.

(5) The Chief Medical Officer may authorise that a rapid antigen test satisfies the requirement under regulation 6 (1) (a) and (b).

### **Offences**

8. (1) A person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(2) A person who is guilty of an offence under subregulation (1) shall be liable on summary conviction, to a fine of ten thousand dollars and to imprisonment for six months, in accordance with section 7 (2) of the Act.

(3) Without prejudice to regulation 6 (2), where a person refuses to make arrangements at a government-approved place of observation and isolation for the purposes of regulation 6 (1) (c) (i)—

- (a) arrangements shall be made on his or her behalf;
- (b) the person shall be charged for such arrangements at a rate of \$200.00 United States Currency for each applicable day or part thereof; and
- (c) the charge under paragraph (b) shall be recoverable by the State as a civil debt.

**Cost of tests for COVID-19**

9. (1) For the purposes of these Regulations, the cost of—
- (a) a PCR test is \$135.00 Eastern Caribbean Currency or its equivalent in United States Currency;
  - (b) a rapid antigen test is \$50.00 Eastern Caribbean Currency or its equivalent in United States Currency.
- (2) Subregulation (1) shall not apply to children twelve years and under.
- (3) Where a person fails to make the payment in respect of a test for COVID-19 conducted on him or her, the fee shall be recoverable by the State as a civil debt.
- (4) The Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Finance may waive the application of subregulations (1) and (3) in respect of a person, if the Permanent Secretary is satisfied that it would be just and equitable in all circumstances to do so.
- (5) All money collected under this regulation shall be paid into the Consolidated Fund.

**Repeal of Quarantine (COVID-19) Regulations, 2020**

10. The Quarantine (COVID-19) Regulations, 2020, SRO No. 58 of 2020 are hereby repealed.


