A. RELATIONSHIP AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Provision of professional efficient and ethical legal services to the Government of Saint Lucia in matters related but not limited to the conduct of Civil Legislation, provision of legal advice, drafting and vetting of contracts and other agreements.
2. Works under the direction of and reports to the Solicitor General.
3. Required to respond whenever necessary to the Attorney General and Permanent Secretary on matters related to work in progress.

B. DUTIES AND TASKS

1. Provides assistance to Crown Counsels III, II and I on complex legal suits by searching reference books, statutes, appeals decisions, and identifying case law on procedural, evidentiary and substantive legal issues.
2. Provides advice and guidance to secretaries on legal precedent, procedures and requirements and responds to escalated difficult cases.
3. Obtains documents from government departments and Ministries required to prepare cases for trial.
4. Researches and analyses documents and case law to ensure the accuracy of advice given to Government Ministries and Departments.
5. Attends meetings and negotiations with opposing parties to facilitate early settlement so as to avoid the necessity and expense of going to trial.
6. Delegates and supervises work of Crown Counsels III, II and I.
7. Prepares legal opinions, files Statements of Case in Magistrate Court, High Court and Appellant Courts in Constitutional and other civil legal proceedings of a complex nature.
8. Appears and represents the Government of Saint Lucia in the District Courts, the High Court and the Court of Appeal in Constitutional and other civil legal proceedings of a complex nature.
9. Negotiates settlement of civil disputes.

10. Confers with colleagues with specialties in appropriate areas of legal issue to establish and verify bases for legal proceedings.
11. Performs administrative and management functions related to the practice of law.
12. Acts as Tutor Ad Hoc in applications for adoption of Infants.
13. Functions as a legal representative of the Government locally, regionally and internationally in matters involving complex constitutional and other civil issues.
14. Appears in appeals in disciplinary matters involving members of the Public Service.
15. Reviews, vets and approves documents for Marriage Licences and Alien Licences applications.
16. Prepares and vets deeds, contracts and Agreements to which Government is a party.
17. Represents the Attorney General on various Statutory Bodies and Committees.
18. Performs such other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Attorney General and the Permanent Secretary.

C. CONDITIONS

1. Functions in a scheduled traveling post and receives basic traveling and mileage allowance in accordance with approved rates.
2. Required to maintain a motor vehicle for the proper performance of duties.
3. Accommodation provided in a general administrative office.
4. Institutional support is provided through appropriate civil service regulations and departmental guidelines.
5. Salary is in accordance with the terms and conditions stipulated by Government in the Estimates/Collective Agreement.

The Commission makes reference to Section 28, subsections (4) and (5):

“(4) Where a person in public life, fails to file a declaration in accordance with this section or without reasonable cause, fails to furnish particulars in accordance with Section 34, the Commission shall publish such fact in the *Gazette* and at least one weekly newspaper in circulation in Grenada.”

(5) “The Commission may, at any time, after the publication made pursuant to section (4), make an *ex parte* application to the Court for an order directing the person in public life to comply with the provisions of the Act and the Court may, in addition to making such an order, impose such conditions as it thinks fit.”

The Commission makes reference also to Section 46, subsection (1)(a):

“A person who –

- (a) fails without reasonable cause, to furnish to the Commission a declaration or further particulars which he or she is required to furnish in accordance with the provisions of this Act; ...

commits an offence, and is liable, on conviction on indictment, to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding five years.”

**NOTICE FROM THE GRENADA AUTHORITY FOR
THE REGULATION OF FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS (GARFIN)**

In accordance with Section 213 of the Insurance Act, Cap. 150 of the 2010 Continuous Revised Edition of the Laws of Grenada, the public is hereby informed that as of March 20, 2026, the under-mentioned Insurance Companies, Association of Underwriters, and Insurance Intermediaries (Adjusters, Agents, Brokers, and Sales Representatives) have been registered to operate in Grenada for the calendar year 2026.

The public is advised that Certificates of Registration are issued to all companies and intermediaries authorised to conduct business under the Insurance Act. Sections 15 (2) and 91 (3) of the Insurance Act require all insurance companies and insurance intermediaries to “*prominently display its certificate of registration at its principal place of business in Grenada, in a place to which the public has access, and a copy of that certificate shall be similarly displayed at each of its branches in Grenada*”. In addition, section 92 states that an insurance intermediary shall produce his/her Certificate of Registration when requested to do so by any person during business.

The assistance of the public is solicited in bringing to the attention of GARFIN any person or institution conducting insurance business in Grenada without a valid insurance licence.

INSPECTION OF MOTOR VEHICLES FOR THE YEAR 2026

OWNERS of Public Service Vehicles (including Motor Omni-buses and hiring cars) Goods Vehicles, Trailers, Private Motor Cycles and Cars, are hereby notified that the yearly inspection of these vehicles will commence as follows:—

INSPECTION PERIOD JANUARY 2ND TO JUNE 30TH 2026 9:00 A.M. – 12:00 NOON AND 1:00 P.M. – 4:00 P.M.

Registration Numbers with Plural Registration Letters

Registered owners of such vehicles should present them to the Inspector of Motor Vehicles at any of the various Inspection Centres. For Public Services, Goods Vehicles & Trailers, inspection should be done early with a view to affecting any alterations that may be necessary to comply with the provisions of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act, and of the Regulations made there-under.

Vehicles must be presented in a thoroughly clean condition, and must have been recently overhauled. The body and wings, axle, chassis, frame, steering arms, springs, trackrods, brake connections, shackles, bolts, nuts, splitpins, engine, engine shield and case, clutch, gearbox, magneto or coil, air filter, carburetor and all working parts must be clean in order to have an examination in full. All splitpins, etc., must be clearly exposed, also chassis and engine numbers. Drivers' seats must be securely fastened so that the driver can have proper control over the vehicle. Spot lights, siren and musical horns and whistles are strictly prohibited. Each vehicle Trailer must have its tare and maximum gross weight painted in white figures not less than 2½ inches in height upon a black background in a conspicuous place on the right or offside of the vehicles.

The licence plates and Identification marks on all vehicles must conform to provisions of S.R. & O. No. 41 Section 4 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Amendment) Regulations 1991 and be in such a condition as to render each letter or figure readily distinguishable. The colour of plates must be YELLOW background, letters and numbers should be black. The attention of owners of Motor Omnibuses and Goods Vehicles is specially directed to Regulation 23 (11) (a) regarding the position of front lamps. SPOT LIGHTS, FOG AND FALSE LAMPS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED except with a

written approval of the Licensing Authority.

The attention of owners of Hiring cars and Motor Omnibuses is directed to Regulation 50 (2) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Regulations Chapter 201 of Volume IX of the Revised Laws of Grenada which required that printed copies of the tariffs and maximum fares be displayed on such vehicles. These are now available and may be purchased at the Treasury, St. George's, and at any District Revenue Office.

Vehicles which may have been found by the Inspector to have defects must not be used on the roads until they have been issued with certificates, certifying that the vehicles have been duly licenced.

N.B. Owners of Motor Vehicles are reminded of Section 11 (9) of the Road Traffic Act, which states that no Motor Vehicle shall be used for more than one (1) month after the change of ownership unless the new owner is registered as the owner thereof.

N.B.: THE MOTOR VEHICLE LICENCE SHALL BE AFFIXED TO THE LOWER END OF THE LEFT SIDE OF THE WINDSCREEN FOR BOTH LEFT & RIGHT HAND DRIVE VEHICLES.
